

Travel to Tanzania

November 4th – Depart US

Important Travel information:

Plane tickets, lodging, most meals, and transportation will all be arranged by Wesley College Foundation. There will be a few meals in transit that are your responsibility. There is some flexibility in international travel as long as it does not interfere with the dates in Mwanza. A safari can also be coordinated by Wesley College Foundation. If you would like to add additional excursions such as a trip to Zanzibar or time around Mt. Kilimanjaro we can connect you to travel businesses that help with trips in those areas.

Trip registration must be completed and a down payment of 75% of the trip cost completed by July 15th since this will cover booking plane tickets. The remaining amount must be received no later than October 1st.

The individual budget may fluctuate some based on flight costs, but you will be advised of that as soon as possible. Any amount paid over will be returned and any additional amount needed will be communicated.

Itinerary Details:

November 7th will be a day at Wesley College touring the campus, meeting staff, and having conversations with students.

November 8th will be a day to meet community partners as well as visit work that Wesley College graduates are doing in the community in order to see the impact of Wesley College in the community.

November 9th will be a day to learn more about the United Methodist Church in Tanzania, local church work, and hear from local church pastors and leaders.

November 10th is a Sunday and will involve worship at a local church for those who are interested, a time in the local market, and some time to relax in Mwanza before starting your excursion.

Trip Preparation:

Visas may be obtained in Tanzania upon landing in Dar es Salaam.

Please review the CDC website for vaccines that are needed, but be advised that the Yellow Fever vaccine is required for entry into Tanzania and is often checked on arrival.

You must have a current passport in order to book flights (so no later than July 15th) and it must be valid for 6 months from the return date of the trip.
